The lesion is often found on the extremities, particularly the fingers and toes. The image shows a large, ulcerated, and bleeding lesion on the lateral aspect of the toe, which is a classic presentation of AMM. The lesion is located on the lateral aspect of the toe, near the base of the nail.
