









Papular urticaria is a common allergic reaction to insect bites, often caused by mosquitoes, fleas, and ticks. It is characterized by small, red, raised lesions (papules) on the skin. The lesions are usually itchy and can be painful. Papular urticaria is most common in children and young adults. It is usually self-limiting and resolves within a few weeks. Treatment includes avoiding the insect, using antihistamines to relieve itching, and applying topical corticosteroids to reduce inflammation.
